This year has been a milestone for Scouting, with strengthened programs, growing membership, and improved facilities—all made possible by our dedicated staff, volunteers, and board.

Scouting continues to thrive, particularly in Troup County and the GHL District, with overall membership growth and a record 313 female participants. In 2024, we launched six new units, expanding opportunities for more youth than ever before.

Camp attendance has increased by 3-5% through summer camps and family camping opportunities. Facility improvements continue, and this year, we are especially proud of the Adirondack buildings, which have housed many youth and adults.

Membership growth remains a top priority. We are committed to ensuring every youth has the opportunity to join Scouting and experience the lifelong benefits of the program.

The Chattahoochee Council provides character development and values-based leadership training to more than 1,800 youth and families, supported by over 800 adult volunteers across 15 counties.

Our mission is to build the next generation of leaders through character development, citizenship training, workforce development initiatives, and physical, mental, and spiritual growth.

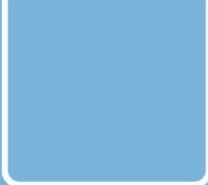

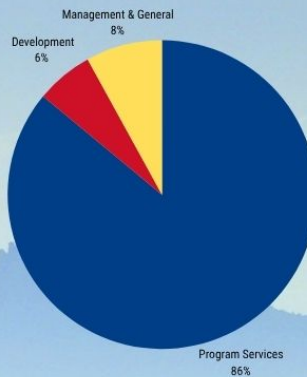
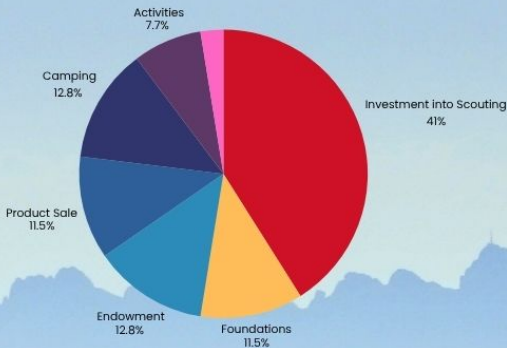


FINANCES AT A GLANCE
